Intersection with contracts and torts was the topic of Tuesday. The presentations from the main facilitator Advocate E.V Chinoda tried to review how animals could be protected using contracts. The participants were engaged in an exciting discussion over domestic animals ownership. The participants were trying to figure out the person who is answerable for a crime against a pet in a set up where a pet is owned by the whole family. It was highlighted in the presentation that contracts are not drawn in most transactions in Africa involving the sale of domestic animals. The participants were taught on the basics of animal contracts and also animal welfare basics. The guest speaker of the day was Dr Muteveri a scientist whose main objective was to show how science and law can work together for animal protection. Dr Muteveri gave a presentation that showed that science enhances knowledge, knowledge creates policy and policy influences legislation.
